EXHIBITOR RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The competition for the Six Nations Agricultural Society prizes is open to all community members of the Six Nations of the Grand River.
2. Each/any eligible person desiring to serve in the activities of the Society must purchase a Six Nations Agricultural Society membership each year to be a member in good standing and must pay an Exhibitor Fee to exhibit their goods for prizes at the Fair. Membership fee waived for Seniors (55 and older) and Persons with Exceptionalities.
3. ANNUAL MEMBERSHIP FEE: A \$10.00 membership to the Six Nations Agricultural Society entitles 1 adult (18 years and older) to serve on the Committee, participate in election of officers and admission to the next years fair.
4. EXHIBITOR FEE: A payment of \$5.00 entitles each member in good standing to exhibit their goods for prizes.
5. While all due care will be taken of articles exhibited and all diligence used for the recovery of any articles that may be lost, the exhibitor shall not hold the Six Nations Agricultural Society responsible for any damage or loss of any article entered for competition.
6. ALL EXHIBITS MUST BE SUBMITTED WITH AN ENTRY TAG FIRMLY ATTACHED WITH NAME, ADDRESS, CLASS AND CATEGORY NUMBER, AND DESCRIPTION FILLED IN. ENTRIES MUST ALSO BE SUBMITTED WITH AN OFFICIAL ENTRY FORM. An exhibit number will be assigned when submitted.

Entry tags will be available one week before and up to the first day of the Fair, at Six Nations Parks and Recreation. The exhibitors name MUST NOT be visible on the entry until after the judging is complete.

7. Exhibits may be registered in person at the Six Nations Community Hall on Wednesday from 4:00 PM until 9:00 PM and then again on Thursday from 8:00 AM to 11:00 AM. PLEASE NOTE: DEADLINE FOR FAIR EXHIBIT WILL BE 11:00 AM ON THURSDAY OF THE FAIR. JUDGING WILL COMMENCE ON THURSDAY AFTERNOON.
8. Exhibitors must be the owner and have manufactured all entries submitted.
9. Exhibitors of roots, vegetables, and fruits must have been raised by them during the present competition year.

10. Exhibitors of grain, roots, vegetables, and fruits must be presented in a uniformed in size of boxes or baskets (except for otherwise specified below).
11. EXHIBITORS ARE ONLY ALLOWED TO MAKE 1 ENTRY PER CATEGORY.
12. An article can be exhibited in competition for prizes for up to 3 YEARS. This rule is strictly enforced.
13. The Judges will not grant prizes for any article or produce if such entry is incorrectly classified and/or tagged, if considered not worthy or if garments have been worn.
14. Exhibits must remain on display in the Community Hall until 4:00 PM on the last day of the fair. At 4:00 PM the Community Hall will close to the public and only exhibitors will be admitted to remove their goods. If any article is taken from the hall before the specified time, the exhibitor of the same, may not be entitled to any prize which may have been awarded. Pies, except for one slice, may be picked up on Thursday after 4:00 PM.
15. Exhibits must be picked up by 6pm on the last day of the fair. Directors are not responsible for articles left after 6pm. Articles may be disposed of.
16. Any person who show attempt to interfere with any Judges while in the discharge of their judging duties or shall on the premises of the society, use any contemptuous or abusive language to any member of Six Nations Agricultural Society or volunteers will forfeit the right to any prize to which he/she may be otherwise entitled and will be excluded from the exhibited exhibition the succeeding year.
17. The decision of the Judge or Judges in awarding prizes will be final.
18. Any protests with respect to the awarding of prizes must be made in writing by the first Monday after the fair and must be accompanied by a cash deposit of \$10 to the Six Nations Agricultural Society Secretary. The deposit will be forfeited if the protest is not substantiated.
19. Any prize money not picked up by October 31st will be donated back to the Six Nations Agricultural Society, Exhibit Division.
20. No person(s) will be permitted onsite during the judging, except Judges, Directors, and Recorders.

ONTARIO ASSOCIATION AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES (OAAS) SPECIAL COMPETITION

Winners of the following are eligible to compete at the District 7 Competition of the Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies, winners then move on to the OAAS Provincial Competition. Please ensure the Six Nations Agricultural Society has your contact information if you receive a District 7 qualifying invitation (will be attached to your exhibit on site at your fall fair exhibition). Each category listed below will be awarded a prize & ribbon of our own local fair competition.

IMPORTANT TO NOTE:

Please visit <https://ontarioagsocieties.com/member-services/competitions> for full eligibility details. Six Nations Agricultural Society has no presiding authority and gives no guarantee that an exhibitor is qualified for the OAAS District 7 Competition whether they win first prize in our local competition or not. OAAS will only accept OAAS qualified exhibitors. Local exhibitor's that qualify for OAAS District 7 Competition is at the sole discretion of the OAAS and not the Six Nations Agricultural Society.

PRIZE AMOUNTS: 1st Place: \$10, 2nd Place: \$8, 3rd Place: \$6

A. BUTTER TART COMPETITION: a total of 6 tarts will be required to be shown. Tarts must be full sized and contain no nuts or fruits (i.e., No raisins or pecans). ***Open to exhibitors/all ages***

B. PLAIN CHOCOLATE CHIP COOKIE COMPETITION: 6 cookies must be displayed. Plain chocolate chip cookies must have no nuts and must be larger than 2.5" (6.5 cm) and no smaller than 2" (5cm). ***Competition is open to youth up to age 15 by December 31st of the current year.***

C. PHOTOGRAPHY COMPETITION: Entries must be submitted on a memory stick, identifying each image with class number and fair name, images must be taken in the current year. Contest objective is to help publicize, create pride in the activities of all Agricultural Societies and fairs in the OAAS and to contribute to the library of images for OAAS promotions. ***Open to exhibitors/all ages***

D. HAND QUILTED COMPETITION: Quilt must be solely made, and hand quilted by the exhibitor and exhibited and judged at a local OAAS fair to be eligible for this competition. Size requirements, total perimeter to be a minimum of 324 inches. ***Open to all exhibitors/all ages***

E. MACHINE QUILTED COMPETITION: Quilt must be solely made, and machine quilted by the exhibitor and exhibited and judged at a local OAAS fair to be eligible for this competition. Size requirements, total perimeter to be a minimum of 324 inches. ***Open to all exhibitors/all ages***

YOUTH POSTER COMPETITION for JUNIOR, INTERMEDIATE AND SENIOR:

Entry Rules:

- Create an original handmade design promoting “Six Nations Fair.”
- Name and date of fair must be clearly shown on poster.
- Poster size: minimum approximately 22cm by 28 cm without border and maximum approximately 28 cm by 44 cm without border.
- Must be centered on a CARDSTOCK or BRISTOL BOARD backing exposing approximately a 5.5 cm border on all sides.
- Six Nations Fair, District #7, age, and owner of poster, with complete mailing address must be clearly labeled on back on entry.

F. JUNIOR POSTER COMPETITION: ***Open to youth up to and including Grade 4***

G. INTERMEDIATE POSTER COMPETITION: ***Open to youth Grade 5 to Grade 8***

H. SENIOR POSTER COMPETITION: ***Open to youth Grade 9 to Grade 12***

I. MAPLE SYRUP COMPETITION: Maple Syrup exhibits shall consist of (2) curved Kent style glass bottles (D&G #505188 Syrup Bottle with Handle) or equivalent of Maple Syrup, Canada Grade A-Amber, each having a capacity of 250 ml. Entries must be labelled on the BOTTOM of the containers only with a supplied entry number or identifier. No other labels will be permitted. ***Open to individuals/family***

J. LIQUID HONEY COMPETITION: Exhibitors of honey must be registered beekeepers and the exhibits shown by them must be pure honey from floral sources in their apiaries. Liquid Honey exhibits shall consist of two clear glass containers, each having a capacity of 500 grams (375 ml). Entries must be labelled on the BOTTOM of the containers only with a supplied entry number or identifier. No other labels permitted. ***Open to individuals/family***
