## EXHIBITOR RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The competition for the Six Nations Agricultural Society prizes is open to all community members of the Six Nations of the Grand River.
2. Each/any eligible person desiring to serve in the activities of the Society must purchase a Six Nations Agricultural Society membership each year to be a member in good standing and must pay an Exhibitor Fee to exhibit their goods for prizes at the Fair.
3. ANNUAL MEMBERSHIP FEE: A $\$ 10.00$ membership to the Six Nations Agricultural Society entitles one adult ( 18 years and older) to serve on the Committee, participate in election of officers and one day admission to the current Six Nations Fall Fair.
4. EXHIBITOR FEE: A payment of $\$ 5.00$ entitles each member in good standing to exhibit their goods for prizes. Exhibitor Fees is not required for Junior entries (18 years and younger) entering Junior classes.
5. HOLD HARMLESS AGREEMENT: In no case shall the Six Nations Agricultural Society be responsible for any damage or loss of any article while being exhibited at the Six Nations Fall Fair. Due care will be taken towards all articles exhibited.
6. ALL EXHIBITS MUST BE SUBMITTED WITH AN ENTRY TAG FIRMLY ATTACHED WITH NAME, CONTACT INFORMATION, CLASS, AND SECTION NUMBER. ENTRIES MUST ALSO BE SUBMITTED WITH AN OFFICIAL ENTRY FORM. An exhibit number will be assigned when Membership fee has been paid.

## Filling out the Entry Form:

Every article is listed in the Prize List with a Class and Section Number. Class numbers are typically at the beginning of the class. Section numbers are listed beside the item description. Fill in the class and section on the Entry Form. E.g. Class 29, Section 2.

Entry tags and Entry Forms will be available one week before and up to the first day of Exhibit Registration, at the Dajoh at Six Nations Parks and Recreation or Tourism at Chiefswood Park. The exhibitors name MUST NOT be visible on the entry tag until after the judging is complete.
7. Annual Memberships and Exhibits may be registered in person at the Six Nations Arena on:

- Tuesday, 3:00 PM until 8:00 PM for Annual Membership Registration
- Wednesday, 3:00 PM until 8:00 PM for Exhibit Registration
- Thursday, 8:00 AM to 10:00 AM, NO LATE EXHIBITS WILL BE ACCEPTED.

8. Exhibitors must be the owner and have manufactured all entries submitted.
9. Exhibitors of roots, vegetables, and fruits must be grown during the present competition year.
10. Exhibitors of grain, roots, vegetables, and fruits must be presented in uniformed size in boxes or baskets (except for otherwise specified).
11. EXHIBITORS ARE ONLY ALLOWED TO MAKE 1 ENTRY PER SECTION.
12. An article can be exhibited in competition for prizes for up to 3 YEARS. This rule is strictly enforced.
13. The Judges will not grant prizes for any exhibit that is incorrectly classified and/or tagged, or if considered not worthy or if garments have been worn.
14. Exhibits must remain on display in the SIX NATIONS ARENA until 4:00 PM on Sunday, the last day of the fair. At 4:00 PM the SIX NATIONS ARENA will close to the public and only exhibitors will be admitted to remove their goods. If any article that is taken from the SIX NATIONS ARENA before the specified time, by exhibitor, they will not be entitled to any prize which may have been awarded. Pies, except for one slice, must be picked up on Thursday after 4:00 PM.
15. Exhibits must be picked up by 6:00 PM on Sunday, the last day of the fair. Directors are not responsible for articles left after 6:00 PM and will be disposed of.
16. Any person who attempts to interfere with any Judges during their judging duties or, use any contemptuous or abusive language to any member of Six Nations Agricultural Society or volunteers will forfeit the right to any prize to which he/she may be otherwise entitled and will be excluded from the exhibition the succeeding year.
17. The decision of the Judge or Judges in awarding prizes will be final.
18. Any protests with respect to the awarding of prizes must be made in writing by the first Monday after the fair and must be accompanied by a cash deposit of $\$ 10.00$ to the Six Nations Agricultural Society Secretary. The deposit will be forfeited if the protest is not substantiated.
19. Any prize money not picked up by September $30^{\text {th }}$ by the exhibitor will be applied to next year's fees for that participant, any amount over that will be donated back to the Six Nations Agricultural Society, Exhibit Division.
20. No person(s) will be permitted onsite during the judging, except Judges, Convenors, and Recorders.

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## ONTARIO ASSOCIATION AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES (OAAS) SPECIAL COMPETITION

Winners of the following are eligible to compete at the District 7 Competition of the Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies, winners then move on to the OAAS Provincial Competition. Please ensure the Six Nations Agricultural Society has your contact information if you receive a District 7 qualifying invitation (will be attached to your exhibit on site at your fall fair exhibition). Each category listed below will be awarded a prize \& ribbon of our own local fair competition.

## IMPORTANT TO NOTE:

Pease visit https://ontarioagsocieites.com/member-services/competitions for full eligibility details. Six Nations Agricultural Society has no presiding authority and gives no guarantee that an exhibitor is qualified for the OAAS District 7 Competition whether they win first prize in our local competition or not. OAAS will only accept OAAS qualified exhibitors. Local exhibitor's that qualify for OAAS District 7 Competition is at the sole discretion of the OAAS and not the Six Nations Agricultural Society.

PRIZE AMOUNTS: $\mathbf{1}^{\text {st }}$ Place: $\$ 10, \mathbf{2}^{\text {nd }}$ Place: $\$ 8,3^{\text {rd }}$ Place: $\$ 6$
A. BUTTER TART COMPETITION: a total of 6 tarts will be required to be shown. Tarts must be full sized and contain no nuts or fruits (i.e., No raisins or pecans). Open to exhibitors/all ages
B. PLAIN CHOCOLATE CHIP COOKIE COMPETITION: six cookies must be displayed. Plain chocolate chip cookies must have no nuts and must be no larger than $2.5^{\prime \prime}(6.5 \mathrm{~cm})$ and no smaller than $2^{\prime \prime}(5 \mathrm{~cm})$. Competition is open to youth up to age 15 by December 31"of the current year.
C. PHOTOGRAPHY COMPETITION: Entries from each society are to be submitted via We Transfer (is free) http://wetransfer.com/ and emailed to: convention@oaasfairs.com. Each image must be identified with class number and fair name in JPEG format, (all photos must be saved in high resolution for the very best quality). Contest objective is to help publicize, create pride in the activities of all Agricultural Societies and fairs in the OAAS and to contribute to the library of images for OAAS promotions. D. HAND QUILTED COMPETITION: Quilt must be solely made, and hand quilted by the exhibitor and exhibited and judged at a local OAAS fair to be eligible for this competition. Size requirements, total perimeter to be a minimum of 324 inches. Open to all exhibitors/all ages
E. MACHINE QUILTED COMPETITION: Quilt must be solely made, and machine quilted by the exhibitor and exhibited and judged at a local OAAS fair to be eligible for this competition. Size requirements, total perimeter to be a minimum of 324 inches. Open to all exhibitors/all ages
F. MAPLE SYRUP COMPETITION: Maple Syrup exhibits shall consist of (1) curved Kent style glass bottles (D\&G \#505188 Syrup Bottle with Handle) or equivalent, of Maple Syrup, Canada Grade A-Amber, each having a capacity of 250 ml . Entries must be labelled on the BOTTOM of the containers only with a supplied entry number or identifier. No other labels will be permitted. Open to individuals/family
G. LIQUID HONEY COMPETITION: Exhibitors of honey must be registered beekeepers and the exhibits shown by them must be pure honey from floral sources in their apiaries. Liquid Honey exhibits shall consist of one (1) clear glass containers, each having a capacity of 500 grams (375 $\mathrm{ml})$. Entries must be labelled on the BOTTOM of the containers only with a supplied entry number or identifier. No other labels permitted. Open to individuals/family
